# Advice for Chief Executives Radiation Incidents which require a Reportable Incident Brief

#### How to use this advice

This advice supplements the NSW Health Incident Management Policy (<u>PD2020\_047</u>). It outlines a sub- set of radiation incidents which require a Reportable Incident Brief (RIB).

### **Background**

The Clinical Excellence Commission reviewed the RIB requirement in the Incident Management Policy for "Radiation incidents reportable to the NSW Environmental Protection Authority under the Radiation Control Act 1990 and the Radiation Control Regulation 2013".

The Clinical Excellence Commission consulted with radiation experts and the Ministry of Health to define a subset of radiation incidents for escalation via RIB to the Ministry of Health.

## Radiation Incidents which require a RIB

- A patient receives an unplanned effective dose of 20 millisieverts (mSv) or greater during a nontherapeutic procedure
- Receipt of a NSW Environmental Protection Authority (EPA) Infringement
- Receipt of a NSW EPA Improvement Notice
- Any accident reported to the NSW EPA that is due to the rapeutic application of radiation
- Any person exceeds the dose limits listed in Schedule 5 of the Radiation Control Regulation. (<a href="https://www.legislation.nsw.gov.au/view/html/inforce/current/sl-2013-0052#sec.3">https://www.legislation.nsw.gov.au/view/html/inforce/current/sl-2013-0052#sec.3</a>)
- A person requires medical attention due to contamination
- A contamination event occurs with potential for media interest and/or significant interruption to service delivery.

# What about radiation incidents involving patient death, serious harm, potential significant risk or affecting multiple patients?

Such incidents are incorporated in the policy into clinical incidents of any type which meet these criteria. Please refer to PD2020 047 Section 3 Reportable Incident Brief (RIB).
